Measures taken to complete the syllabus of courses and programs.	<p>Sophia College with its academic autonomy is extremely particular about the content and quality of syllabus across courses and programs. Even during the pandemic situation Syllabuses were completed in their entirety At the beginning of the year certain descriptive subunits were assigned to students as guided self-study topics. It implied providing learners extensive study material for those subtopics with guidelines about preparation. Special efforts were taken to make online teaching-learning effective. The following steps are pertinent -</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. G-Suite new domain sophiacollege.edu.in was acquired.</li> <li>2. Every student was assigned institutional with G-suite email ids.</li> <li>3. Zoom licenses were purchased for this academic year for lecturers.</li> <li>4. Whatsapp groups were formulated for every class to facilitate quick communication.</li> <li>5. Google classrooms were generated for every class.</li> <li>6. Faculty predominantly used Zoom platform to lecture Google classrooms were utilized effectively for releasing study material, making announcements, conducting graded &amp; revision tests. Method used: Zoom links are created for lectures beforehand. Links are emailed and/or posted on Whatsapp groups. Attendance is traced with the help of Google form/Zoom spreadsheet. Chatbox is utilized many lecturers mailed links to students who were unable to access lectures due to connectivity issues.</li> <li>7. Additional reference material, Youtube links were provided to students through Google classrooms.</li> </ol> <p>The following software were utilised by the college students and teachers for their lectures:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• College acquired Google official domain (sophiacollege.edu.in) with GSuite; every lecturer was authorised to generate Google classrooms for every course and students were assigned institutional Ids</li> <li>• Zoom licenses were purchased for lecturers</li> <li>• Lecturers had training sessions in utilising Google classrooms and Zoom Sessions.</li> </ul> <p>Lecturers as well students are given N list membership. Sophia College believes in continuous assessment of students. Assessment was conducted at two levels. IA (Internal Assessment) &amp; SEE (Semester End Examination)</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. For IA different departments used different and innovative methods. Google forms were used for objective (MCQ etc) type questions. PPT's projects were submitted and presented in Google classrooms.</li> <li>2. For SEE Examination <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• For FY &amp; SY levels MCQ type questions papers were formulated.</li> <li>• For TY batches however, in line with Sophia standards a component of subjective answers for 20 marks was administered in addition to MCQs</li> <li>• Proctored Zoom meetings in combination with Google classrooms were utilized to conduct examination</li> <li>• For subjective component students wrote answers, scanned it and uploaded it on Google classroom.</li> <li>• Results are made available on MIS</li> </ul> </li> </ol> <p>Continuous feedback was acquired from the students to assess the impact of virtual teaching on them. Their suggestions were discussed in staff meetings and relevant ones were adopted appropriately.</p>
