### STUDENT ASSESSMENT in each semester:

### I. Internal Assessment (IA): 50 marks

- 1. The Internal Assessment is a separate head of passing.
- 2. Internal Assessment comprises two activities of 16 marks each, and 8 marks for class participation
- 3. An additional 16-mark Internal Assessment activity will be held ONLY for those who missed any one or both of the two activities, due to valid reasons, or failed.
- 4. The student should get a minimum of 20 marks out of 50 to be declared PASS in the course.
- 5. If the student does not get 20 marks out of 50, the student will have to appear for the Internal Assessment ATKT assessment.

### II. Semester End Examination (SEE): 50 marks

- 1. The Semester End Examination is a separate head of passing.
- 2. The student should get a minimum of 20 marks in SEE to be declared PASS in the course.
- 3. All units of the syllabus will be covered in SEE and will be given equal weightage.
- 4. An additional SEE will be held for those who are absent, due to valid reasons, for the main/regular SEE.
- 5. If the student does not get 20 marks out of 50, the student will have to appear for the Semester End ATKT Examination.
