PRINCIPAL'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2022-2023

Theme of the Year: "RECOVER *DISCOVER* EMPOWER"

Section I

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

1. The college was reopened for all the batches of students after the Covid 19 pandemic. Orientation sessions were conducted for FY, SY, TY, MSc, and MA students in Sophia Bhabha Hall.

2. Infrastructural Changes:

The science building, science department laboratories, lab equipment, computers and computer laboratories were inspected for security and safety. Repairs and upgrading were carried out as per the requirements of the respective departments. The Biochemistry department (which is now closed) is converted into a Postgraduate classroom and a PhD lab for the Biological Sciences. A 'Kindle Corner' has been set up in the library and is ready to use for students and faculty. Room no 29 has been made into a well-equipped 'Studio' for e-content generation, with the RUSA grant.

3. RUSA:

The second installment has been fully utilized. The projected expenditure has been presented to the RUSA authorities. We are awaiting the final installment of RUSA funds.

4. Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, an initiative by the GOI has been celebrated by the college in a variety of ways.

On the occasion of the 75th year of Azadi ka Amrit Mahotsav, Sophia College celebrated Independence Day on August 15, 2022 by the flag hoisting which was followed by a cultural programme. The Dept. of Physical Education and the NSS unit of Sophia College organised a peace march from the college campus to August Kranti Maidan. There were approximately 550–600 students accompanied by faculty members. Special guest lectures, workshops, debates and seminars were organized in the college to commemorate the 75th Independence Day.



5. Preparation of NAAC: Meetings were conducted with NAAC criteria committees. The committees met regularly with their coordinators. The initial rounds of data collection and compilation have been conducted.



6. Preparation for the implementation of the New Education Policy 2020: The preparation began with a technical meeting with Dr Bhalchandra Bhole (Consultant, IQAC Cluster, Maharashtra) of all the heads of department and the course coordinators. Two nodal officers and the NEP core committee worked relentlessly to customize the NEP design for the college. DSCs (Department specific courses) as well as the CCs (Common courses) for Semesters 1 and 2 were finalized.

7 Audits: A. Green audit was conducted, and a report was submitted on **10th December 2022**. Mr. Ram Patil, Head and Promoter, Institute for Sustainable Energy, Environment and Economy (ISEEE) was the auditor.



B. An internal **academic audit** for the academic year 2021-2022 was conducted on **the 23rd and 24th January 2023** for Science and Arts respectively. Dr Ignat Mendes, Ms. Gilda Pereira, Dr Yasmin Khan, and Dr Chinmoyee Vatsyayan were the auditors.

C. An **examination audit** for the AY 2021-2022 was conducted on **23rd January 2023**. Dr Rajendra Shinde, Principal, St. Xavier's College (Autonomous), Mr. Wilson Rao, COE, Jai Hind College (Autonomous), and Mr. Manish Gogari, Convenor of Exam committee, Mithibai College (Autonomous) were the external auditors/experts.



D. A Gender **audit** was conducted on **27th March 2023**. Professor Vibhuti Patel, Dr. Lily Bhushan and Dr. Hrishikesh Samant were the external auditors. A report on the activities under the gender perspective was submitted.

A lot of students participated in these trials and gave their best performances to be selected in teams. The department offers them opportunities to explore various games and learn different skills.
- Intercollegiate Competition - The DSO Intercollegiate Competition started in the month of September. Our students participated in various games, including team and individual sports, where they got ranked in the top three. We have participated in football, volleyball, basketball, shooting, judo, etc.
- Annual Sports Week and Sports Day: Our Sophia College sports week started at the end of November. It was a week packed with activity, which included sports matches (langadi, lagori and throwball) as well as students hanging up posters, collecting names of participants, and practicing marching around campus, leading up to the final event, Annual Sports Day, on December 2, 2022. Heats and eliminations were scheduled for the preceding day. It was held at the University of Mumbai Sports Pavilion, where events were held for both junior and senior college students as well as staff. The track events ranged from the 100m to the 800m, and the field events included the shot put, discus, and javelin throws, as well as the long jump and high jump. The participants in the 100m, 200m, and 400m were extremely enthusiastic and motivated in spite of running multiple races.

Section III _Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC)

A RUSA-supported **Faculty Development workshop** was organized on integrating Educational Outcomes into the Curriculum on **14th June 2022** by Professor Kalpana Chavan, St. Xavier’s Institute of Education.

A **SWAYAM course orientation** was held on **1st and 2nd July 2022** for SYBSc IT and SYBA Div. A, B and C

Keeping in mind the theme of the year “Recover, Discover and Empower”, a **Student Enrichment Program** for senior college students was organized on **22nd July 2022**, during the long break, at Sophia Bhabha Hall. The topic of the program was ‘Strategies for Navigating Uncertain Times’, and the speaker was Dr. Fr. Roy Pereira. The event, which was open to senior college students, was a huge success. The program, as the name implies, primarily focused on how students can strategize for navigating uncertain times such as the COVID-19 pandemic. The speaker focused on keeping things positive, fun, and educational so that the students could enjoy and understand what was said. Students gave positive feedback about the session. According to them, the program helped them a lot, and the speaker was very knowledgeable and interactive, which made the session even more interesting. The PowerPoint presentation by the speaker helped them in understanding the concepts and the purpose of the program. The students expressed their wish of having more such programs.



Given the forthcoming NAAC, IQAC revised the D1 (Teacher’s activity/Participation), D2 (Research activity report), D3 (Teaching methodologies) and D4 (Departmental activities) **Documentation** Google forms for the academic year 2022-2023. These Google forms were assigned in the NAAC Documentation and the HODs Google classrooms on **30th August 2022**. These were running

submissions, and staff members were asked to fill and submit these Google forms as and when they completed an activity. An orientation session regarding Documentation for the AY 2022-2023 was held on **5th August 2022**. A new Google form D5 was introduced from the AY 2022-2023 onwards, which consisted of NAAC criteria I, II and V. This was posted in the HODs classroom as well.

Meetings were also conducted with NAAC criteria committees in preparation for NAAC. The committees met regularly under their coordinators, represented by NAAC Consultant / IQAC Coordinator/ QDC.

Workshops were conducted on the **3rd and 4th of October 2022** to discuss specific NAAC criteria templates and details.

The **reporting system** was reorganized. Apart from the clubs, associations and student initiatives were brought under reporting and the templates for the reporting have been revised as per the NAAC requirements.

Data and the applications for **India Today, NIRF and the Week** were submitted successfully. Our college was ranked as the **third-best college** in the city of Mumbai and **third-best** in the western region of India in the general category as per the India Today Survey 2023.

Our college also secured 23rd rank according to the WEEK Survey at the All India level.

Feedback forms were revised for the AY 2022-2023. Entry-level questionnaires were administered for the academic year 2022-2023. The forms were shared with FYBA, FYBSc, FY(BASCJ), and FYBSc IT students, and also with PG students (MA-I, MSc-I) and students of Quality Assurance PG Diploma. Exit feedback questionnaires were administered to all TY (BA/BSC/BA-SCJ/IT), MA-II, MSc-II and QA students. Gender audit questionnaires/ Gender Feedback were also successfully conducted for all the students (FY/SY/TY/MA/MSC/QA). TAQs and the Student Satisfaction survey were conducted for the AY 2022-2023.

A **session** on ‘Responsible Citizenship: An Orientation on Income Tax’ was organized in collaboration with the Income Tax Department. It was held for the FYBA students of the college on **30th August 2023**. It was conducted by guest speakers Ms. Soumya Anand, Assistant Commissioner of Income Tax, and Mr. Mayank Mishra, Deputy Commissioner of Income Tax, in the Sophia Bhabha Hall. The session covered some fundamental topics of income tax which included how tax is collected, the indirect taxes we all pay, how the tax we pay is used for the development of the country, how the government gets its revenue, the growth in taxes seen in recent years with the highest collection being made in the financial year 21-22 and more.

The Department of Sociology and IQAC organized a **National Conference** on ‘Academia and Contemporary Research: Roots and Routes’, on **16th September 2022**. This conference was supported by the RUSA Grant. It was held at the Convention Centre and was open to all teaching faculty as well as to PhD research scholars. It included four sessions, each with a different theme, dealt with multiple aspects of the research procedure starting from what exactly constituted research, research ethics as well as how to go about conducting it, and ending with the multiple fellowships and mediums that could be utilized for the publishing of one’s research and academic work.
